Everett started his legal career at the Baltimore County State's Attorney's office in Towson, Maryland. During his career as a prosecutor, Everett handled a large variety of cases in both District and Circuit Court. Everett was the supervisor of the Carjacking and Auto Theft unit for a number of years and was responsible for the charging of all carjacking and serious auto theft matters in Baltimore County. As head of that unit, Everett worked closely with the Baltimore County Police department, and was the point person for legal questions coming out of the Department's Auto Theft Unit.

Since 2024, Everett has worked with the Maryland Attorney General's Office representing the Maryland State Police in civil matters and advising on a variety of subjects, including handgun licensing issues and administrative matters.
