## Question Formulation/Infanticide Case Study

This presentation is a Case Study relating to the polygraph testing of three suspects in a 2016 Infanticide. The focus is on the importance of proper question formulation, especially as it relates to the issue/relevant question where there are multiple suspects in an investigation.
